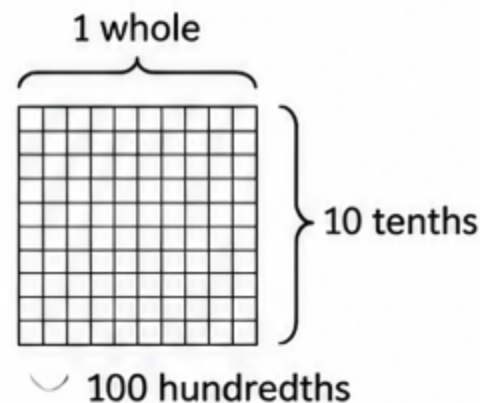


# Shading Decimal Grids

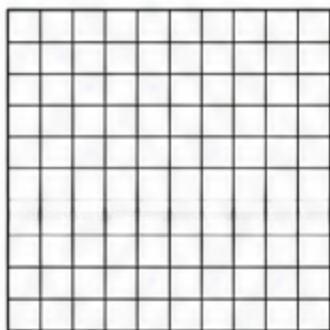

Each small square is 1 hundredth (0.01).

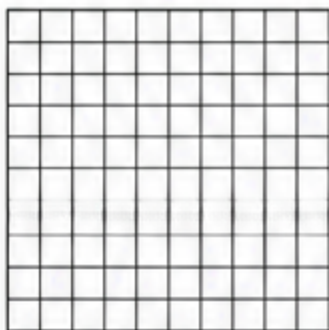
Example: 0.37 means 37 hundredths.
